# **Institutional Development Plan**

## **1. Introduction**

Jaisinghpur is a small town in the Kangra district of Himachal Pradesh. It is situated on the right bank of river Beas which enhances its picturesque beauty. It was named after the Katoch king Maharaja Jai Singh. It is also the birthplace of the famous Katoch king of Kangra, Maharaja Sansar Chand, who was born here in 1765 AD at Bijapur, 3 km from the present Jaisinghpur town. The town abounds in the temples of ancient architectural excellence that are an integral part of its historical, cultural, and spiritual heritage.

Erstwhile Vyas Valley Private College was taken over by the government on 6<sup>th</sup> February 2007 and named after Kanwar Durga Chand. Kanwar Durga Chand was one of the towering personalities of Himachal Pradesh in the field of social service and politics. The college possesses adequate infrastructure in terms of classrooms, labs, library, canteen, girls' common room and playground. The college is affiliated with Himachal Pradesh University Shimla/Sardar Patel University Mandi HP and is covered under sections 2(f) and 12(b) of the UGC Act 1956. It imparts education in Humanities, Commerce, and Sciences at the undergraduate level. It is a rural college that caters to the needs of people from far-flung areas. It aims at imparting education that inculcates a sense of devotion and service among the students. Indeed, this college is proving to be a key factor in providing quality education to the people of this region. It is a co-educational institution in which 476 students are enrolled in all three faculties, out of which 294 are girls and 186 are boys for the session 2023-24. The institution has both experienced as well as young faculty and the entire infrastructure available in the college makes it possible to offer students a quality teaching-learning environment.
